JustFAITH offers an opportunity for parishioners to experience a spiritual journey into compassion. Most of us long to be a generous and compassionate people. However, the opportunities to explore our Catholic social teachings in a deliberate and engaging way have largely not been available.

JustFAITH, now offered in hundreds of parishes across the country, is an intensive education and formation program for adults who are interested in social ministry and social justice. The program includes readings, videos, and conversations about the most difficult topics, face-to-face encounters with the poor, and an investigation into the intersection of spirituality and Christian activism. The program is designed to empower and transform participants so that they can become voices for the voiceless and agents of God's good news to the poor.

Throughout the program, three primary themes are addressed:

1. Theological/Biblical/Doctrinal: Who is God? Who is Jesus? Who are we?
2. Sociological/Political: What does the world today look like and why?
3. Given #1 and #2: What is my role as a Christian in the world today?

The primary focus of JustFAITH is on domestic and international poverty. The intention of JustFAITH is to help participants see the world with eyes wide open and recognize God's call in fresh and critical ways.

JustFAITH will be offered at Our Lady of Peace beginning this fall. Participation will be limited to the first 15 registrants. Registration will be after all Masses the weekends of May 30-31 and June 6-7. **For more information contact Deacon Paul at 612-824-3455 ext. 513.**

Its goal is to eliminate substandard housing and homelessness worldwide and to make affordable shelter a matter of conscience and action. Since its founding HFH has built 300,000 homes worldwide. The Twin Cities branch of HFH was founded in 1985 and has built nearly 750 homes in the seven county metro area. Our Lady of Peace is a member of NOKOMIS BUILDS, a group of 6 south Minneapolis churches that partner with Thrivent Financial and a family to build a home for that family.
