As summer begins, it is a good time to highlight some exciting developments this past year in Our Lady of Peace's ministry to youth. This past year, I have appreciated all the hard work of staff, parents and other volunteers to improve how we connect with our young people and show how parish participation can be a positive experience for them and their families. Here are just some examples of what is happening in the area of ministry to our youth.

This week we will welcome many of our young people to our campus at **Vacation Bible Camp**. It has been such a hit that this year, the applications to participate exceeded our capacity and so unfortunately we could not take everyone who had interest. Besides the kids, each year at camp, a number of high school leaders also step forward to help make for a very positive experience for kids ages three through (going into) fifth grade. Also, this past year a number of high school-aged kids participated in what was called **The Dead Theologians Society**, a program which started in other dioceses and brings together young people to reflect on lives of important figures and saints in our tradition and connect them with their lives today. There were many good conversations and a number of fun activities as well.

Later this summer, a group of high school students will be going on a **mission trip to Red Lake Indian Reservation** where they will learn and work in two primary ministries – with children and in home improvement. Mission trips such as these help our young people experience and preach the Gospel by learning the situations and challenges others face and by rolling up their sleeves and allowing God to shine through the work of their hands.

For those in middle school, last summer we began a program called **Summer Stretch** which we are bringing back this year because of its popularity. Summer Stretch brings kids together to enjoy opportunities for prayer and learning, service and other activities for some good wholesome summer fun. Here too, high school students have an opportunity to become mentors to their younger brothers and sisters in Christ.

When we add these to other ministry areas of music, lectoring and Eucharistic ministry as well as opportunities such as Living Stations, helping at Children's
