A couple of weeks ago we had a funeral of a longtime parishioner, Ginni Wold, who passed away after battling pancreatic cancer which was diagnosed just a couple of months after her husband, Bob, died. Ginni and Bob are survived by their two teenage sons who will now live with Ginni's sister-in-law and will certainly need the support of loved ones while they begin to reinvent life without their parents. Part of what made Ginni's funeral a beautiful celebration was the large show of support from friends, family and parishioners, and after the funeral there was a nice reception in Pates Hall. It is there at the reception that we witnessed the miracle of "the multiplication of the bars" as I called it.

In preparation for the funeral and the anticipated larger than usual numbers of guests as it was heard that the DeLaSalle High School football team and others were coming, the call went out for more bars and baked goods for the reception. The response was overwhelming as people showed their support by bringing more bars and baked goods than Pates Hall has probably ever seen. Not only were guests able to enjoy them at the reception, there were so many guests were also invited to take a plate home with them. It seems so simple but such a response sends an incredible message of support to the family that they are not alone in their journey.

The fact is, that almost every funeral which happens here is supported by such generosity. Time and time again I hear comments from those who came to a funeral and enjoyed the luncheon afterward how wonderful the hospitality is in this parish. It is a quiet, behind the scenes ministry that reaches out and has an impact for not only family members but also for those who may attend church services weekly, and also those who may have not visited a church in quite some time. Among the many other ministries which do the same, this is a wonderful witness of what community is all about.

On behalf of the parish and all of those families who have benefited from the miracles of generosity which happen each funeral luncheon and reception, I would like to thank those involved in this important ministry. If others are interested in joining this ministry they could use more volunteers to help.
